*Applicants should be knowledgeable of the AVDA Scholarship Policies.


*Recipients will be chosen in June 2024


AMANDA SHADE My Dream Horse

I have been riding horses since I was in diapers. My grandma (Anita Faoro) ignited my passion for riding horses by giving me the opportunity to ride her horse Orso, who later became mine. After



spending years riding and showing using my quarter horse Rocky for everything from 4-H to quarter horse to dressage I wanted to pursue my dream horse, where my grandma and mom were right there supporting me to do so. I had been looking for almost two years looking for a warmblood within my budget, where of all places a post on Craigslist for an 18.1 hand Oldenburg was posted. I immediately called and Sabrina Bablitz answered and scheduled an appointment for me to come do a test ride. That weekend my grandpa even moved his branding of cattle, so I could try out the horse I had dreamed of. At first sight I fell in love with this gorgeous 18.1 hand bay with the challenging name Werbenschoen, but everyone just calls him Will. The first step we took it felt as if I was floating or flying and I knew I wanted to adopt him. Sabrina then vetted me and my family out and I went up everyday for a week to ride Will to make sure it was a good fit. I began to load Will when he looked over the top of the 6 foot 6 trailer and he didn't fit, so my grandpa and dad had to raise the trailer to 7 foot 6. I was final-

Iy able to bring Will home, where he had to adjust to more of a farm lifestyle with the cows nearby. We began riding and competing within two months with the help of Margie McNew, my mom, my grandma and Julie. I would travel a block down the road once a week to ride with Margie and learn all of Will's cues and buttons from her. That year Will truly surpassed my wildest of dreams by winning RMDS training level younger rider Championships. The next two years Will dealt with some health issues that Molly Kaplan helped with and I remained by his side as he tolerated me learning on him the correct way.

Last two years, we began traveling to ride at Tristan Faith barn under Amber Clarks instructions as I worked Will back into shape.
